BV Database Transition

We are excited to announce that the newly developed OneSource database went live on September 1, 2023, and ran smoothly. We received positive feedback from our shippers.

The old E-Base database was at the end of its useful life, and it was becoming increasing difficult to resolve outage issues in a timely manner. Additionally, changes in technology and security protocols, particularly when operating in an international IP environment, had resulted in some of our members experiencing problems accessing

some internet addresses. In order to ensure the level of service that we believe all AFSL members deserve, the AFSL and BV teams worked to improve system availability, reliability, and data security. Before we launched the new system, several shippers tested the system and BV provided training sessions and a user manual to all the shippers. After transferring all the data from the old E-Base system, the OneSource database was launched.

The new system improves the user interface, increases reliability and security, enhances user management, and improves reporting capabilities. In the OneSource system, users can manage their own passwords, self-register multiple users, and have varying permissions depending on roles.

With the new features of the system, we have additional opportunities to enhance the database. We are planning to develop a chemical composition screening test planning and tracking module; record re-packing of previously certified lots; place the factory registration program into the system; and implement e-filing of Certificate of Compliance. When the system is ready, BV technicians will have tablets in hand when they perform the field test, fill out the test results, and send the reports back to the office electronically. This feature will greatly improve the legibility of the test reports.

We would like to thank the shippers, who volunteered to perform the testing, for their efforts in developing the new system. If you have any questions or suggestions regarding the new system, please do not hesitate to contact us.

Fire Services Training Wraps Up 2023 with a Trip To Louisiana By Jay Howell

We've had the opportunity to work with quite a few folks from State Fire Marshal Offices through the free training we provide on consumer fireworks. This year, we've met with teams from Georgia, South Carolina, New York, Virginia, Ohio, and Panama City Beach Florida. We'll finish up this year's training with a trip to Baton Rouge, thanks to the efforts of Deputy Chief Russell Shoultz and Jerry Wingard.

The training informs the participants on how to identify potentially illegal explosives (a.k.a. overload fireworks) and how to safely develop the evidence necessary to convince the judicial system to move forward with a case. We intend to continue to develop our relationships with State Fire Marshals across the country and expand our program in 2024.
